

The Mohave County Board of Supervisors ("Board of Supervisors") adopted a fiscal year 1999-2000 budget for Mohave County ("the Budget") on Monday, August 9, 1999. In the Budget, the Board of Supervisors has allocated insufficient funds for the operation of the judicial branch in Mohave County.

The judicial branch diligently has followed all relevant procedural steps in its attempt to obtain necessary funding from the Board of Supervisors. Indeed, the judicial branch has gone to extraordinary lengths to highlight its plight and to demonstrate to the Board of Supervisors why additional funds should be allocated for Court operations. Those efforts have been unsuccessful.

On June 30, 1999, the Board of Supervisors tentatively adopted the proposed FY1999-2000 budget submitted by the County Manager for the Superior Court. The recommended allocation was \$1,905,326. This represents a cut of \$209,347 -- approximately 10% -- from the baseline set by the Mohave County Finance Department for

1 the Superior Court's FY1999-2000 budget, and a reduction of \$230,147 -- approximately
2 11% -- from the Superior Court's FY1998-1999 appropriation. On behalf of the entire
3 judicial branch, the Superior Court made a presentation to the Board of Supervisors on June
4 30 (both in written and oral form), but to no avail; the Board of Supervisors did not alter the
5 County Manager's original recommendation of funds for any of the courts and/or court
6 departments.

7 One week later, prior to the adoption of the tentative Budget by the Board of
8 Supervisors on July 9, 1999, the Superior Court again provided written justification for its
9 request for increased funds. Again, the request went unheeded.

10 Finally, on August 6, 1999, the Superior Court once again requested that the Board
11 of Supervisors reconsider its decision and allocate additional funds for all judicial
12 operations in Mohave County; the Board of Supervisors ignored that request. As a result,
13 the judicial branch has no remedy but to order the Board of Supervisors to increase the
14 funding for judicial branch operations.

15 **I. Background.**

16 The following principles of law are unquestioned:

- 17 • The judicial branch of government is and must remain an independent and
18 autonomous branch of government.
- 19 • The Supreme Court, such intermediate appellate courts as provided by law,
20 the superior court, and justice courts all are part of an integrated judicial
21 department in the State of Arizona.¹
- 22 • The presiding judge in each county is vested by the Arizona Supreme Court
23 with administrative responsibility for all courts in the county, be they the

1 superior court or justice courts, along with the operation of the clerk of court
2 and other operations necessary for the administration of justice.²

- 3 • The presiding judge has authority to order that additional funds be provided
4 to support the court system so long as such order is not arbitrary, capricious,
5 or unreasonable.³

6 It is on the authority of these principles that the following order is entered.

7 **II. Specific Budget Examples.**

8 The Court has reviewed each of the specific line items set forth in Exhibit A. The
9 Court finds that each line item is reasonable and is related to the effective administration of
10 justice in Mohave County. It is therefore Ordered that each specific line item be funded as
11 enumerated.

12 It is not necessary for the purposes of this Administrative Order to identify the
13 rationale behind each specific line item. In written budget proposals, oral testimony, and
14 correspondence, the judicial branch has identified adequate support for each line item.
15 Further, the Court finds that each line item is properly charged to the County, either under
16 law, specific statute, or the general statutory responsibility of the County to fund the
17 superior and justice courts. It also should be noted that the Superior Court has reduced its
18 request \$260,452 from the original requested amount.

19 The Court will address a few of the larger Superior Court line items in this Order.

20 One of the most important aspects of this Administrative Order relates to the
21 implementation of a court security program. The Mohave County courts are currently left
22 largely defenseless in this age of increasing violence. The Courts are not willing to tempt
23 fate with the lives and safety of Mohave County citizens. The Courts will hire two court
24 security officers for the Mohave County Courthouse; arrange for contract security services

1 for the Justice Courts in Bullhead City, Kingman, and Lake Havasu City; and install
2 appropriate security equipment in all Court facilities. The total cost to implement this
3 security program is approximately \$232,000.

4 A second aspect relates to personnel issues. More than one year ago, the Superior
5 Court established a separate merit system for judicial employees in Mohave County. The
6 Superior Court desired to hire a personnel manager and a secretary to oversee and
7 implement this merit system, which the Court deemed necessary to protect and ensure the
8 independence of the court system in Mohave County. After much deliberation, the Court
9 and the Board of Supervisors agreed through resolution that the Court could retain such
10 staff to be paid out of the Superior Court's budget. Shortly thereafter, however, the Board
11 of Supervisors slashed the Courts' budget -- and the funds for this position. The Court has
12 determined that a personnel manager is necessary to ensure that the Court is capable of
13 attracting and retaining employees necessary to administer justice effectively in Mohave
14 County. Expenditures relating to all additional personnel functions requested amount to
15 approximately \$127,000.

16 Further, funds are necessary to open and operate an additional pod of the new
17 juvenile detention center. The facility is nearly completed, but insufficient funds have been
18 allocated to operate it. Approximately \$161,000 is ordered to fund the opening and
19 operation of an additional pod, which the Court deems necessary to dispense justice in
20 Mohave County and to provide for the safety of Mohave County citizens.

21 Additional aspects relate to expenses necessary to implement responsibilities
22 imposed upon the Mohave County Court System by state law. For instance, the Superior
23 Court entered into a contract with seven private attorneys to provide mandatory legal
24 services to indigents in juvenile dependency cases. That two-year contract is unlikely to be
25 renewed in FY2000 without additional funding. Thus, to provide these mandated services,

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
1 an additional allocation of approximately \$37,000 is required. Additionally, Court-ordered
2 investigations, which are also mandated by Arizona law, are estimated to cost
3 approximately \$12,000 more than the allocated amount. These costs are mandated by state
4 law and must be funded.

5 Remaining line items are identified and summarized in the attached Exhibit A.

6 **III. Conclusion.**

7 Having exhausted all appropriate procedural opportunities to present these issues to
8 the Board of Supervisors, and having been rebuffed at every point, the Court, acting under
9 its authority as provided by the Arizona Constitution and Arizona Supreme Court
10 Administrative Order 96-32, which allows for the oversight of the administration of justice
11 throughout Mohave County, hereby Orders the Board of Supervisors, through the County
12 Manager, along with those subject to their supervision and control, to increase funding to
13 the judicial branch in Mohave County by \$867,234 in accordance with the summaries set
14 forth in Exhibit A and as provided through supportive administrative orders set forth in
15 Exhibit B.

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
